THE VISIT OF INDIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY DISTRICT OFFICER : 07-08-2025

STAFF MEETING REPORT Date: 07-08-2025

A staff meeting was convened on 7th August 2025 in the Principal's chamber of GDC, Rayachoty. The meeting was presided over by the Principal and attended by all teaching and non-teaching staff members. The following key issues were discussed:

1. Improvement in Admissions:

Strategies to improve student admissions for the current academic year were discussed. Faculty members were advised to take proactive steps to reach out to potential students and create awareness about the available courses and facilities. Suggestions included visiting nearby junior colleges, organizing awareness campaigns, and utilizing social media platforms.

2. Fitting of Motor to the New Borewell:

The issue of installing a motor to the newly dug borewell within the college premises was discussed. It was decided to expedite the process to ensure regular water supply to the college.

3. **Septic Tank Issue:** The problem related to the overflow and drainage of the septic tank was taken



up. The staff discussed possible solutions and decided to consult local municipal authorities or a sanitation engineer for immediate rectification.

4. Bridge Courses for First Year Students:

The need for conducting bridge courses for newly admitted first-year students was emphasized. These courses aim to help students transition smoothly into degree-level academics by strengthening their foundational knowledge. Faculty members were requested to plan and schedule the courses in their respective departments.

The meeting concluded with a call for collective efforts from all staff members to ensure smooth functioning of the college and improvement in all focus areas.



National De-Worming Day On 12th August 2025, the National De-Worming Day was celebrated at Government Degree College, Rayachoty under the supervision of NSS Programme Officers Sri K. Gurappa and Sri A. Khaja Vice Khirni, along with RRC Co-ordinator Dr. Bommala Venkata Rao.

The programme was graced by Chief Guest Dr. M. Muniya Naik, Vice Principal, and jointly organized by the Department of Zoology and Smt. Battu Shanta Kumari, Lecturer in Botany. On this occasion, awareness was created among students about the significance of National De-Worming Day in preventing parasitic infections and improving overall health.

National Deworming Day (NDD) is an initiative of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, launched in 2015. It is observed twice a year—on 10th February and 10th August—to reduce the burden of soil-transmitted helminth (worm) infections among children and adolescents aged 1–19 years.

The programme aims to improve overall health, nutritional status, concentration, and school attendance by administering a safe, single dose of Albendazole to all targeted children and adolescents. Deworming is done in schools, Anganwadi's, and colleges through trained teachers, health workers, and NSS volunteers.

Regular deworming helps break the cycle of worm transmission, ensuring a healthier and more productive young generation.

As part of the initiative, Albendazole tablets were distributed to students. Teaching and non-teaching staff, along with a large number of students, actively participated, making the programme a success.



Mass Pledge Against Drug Abuse Nasha Mukth Bharat Abhiyan – Ministry of Home Affairs 13-08-2025

The NSS Unit I & II of Government Degree College, Rayachoty, organized a Mass Pledge Against Drug Abuse on 13th August 2025 as part of the Nasha Mukth Bharat Abhiyan initiated by the Ministry of Home Affairs.
